Who are we?

CJ CJ's Supportive Living Program is a State licensed and certified residential drug and alcohol treatment facility. We operate a social model recovery program utilizing an individualized treatment plan as the core of the services offered to our clients. We are a part of a collaboration with the following agencies: CDCR Office of Community Programs, Local CDCR Parole, CBHS Department of Public Health, BHAC Behavioral Health Assessment Center, other local treatment providers. This team of service providers is known as the Bay Area Parole Services Network (BASN).



Who do we serve?

We serve CDCR Parolees who reside in the city and county of San Francisco. We offer our services exclusively to men, ranging from age 18 and older. All of our clients have criminal backgrounds and histories of substance abuse.

Supportive Living Program (SLP) has a sterling record of successfully engaging parolees in treatment while addressing their need for education, employment, family reunification, and securing permanent housing. We help clients avoid reoffending and returning to the painful experiences of addiction and re-incarceration.

We provide up to six months of residential treatment followed by exit strategies designed to offer a network of support to ensure successful transition from program dependency towards greater degrees of self-reliance. We solicit family and community support, and other agency referrals to ensure long-term success for our clients.

How are clients referred?

Clients must be on state parole and be referred by their parole agent with a form 1502. Initial referrals are made to BHAC at 1380 Howard Street, San Francisco, who then conducts an assessment and refers the client to an appropriate treatment modality, such as SLP.

Our success is ultimately realized when we are able to encourage and assist clients in developing the tools needed to address their substance abuse and criminal past. We understand these issues are part of a health crisis and a drain on our economic resources.

We recognize that all human beings have a capacity for reform and redemption.
