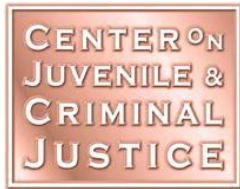

On October 12-13, 2011, the collective agencies presented their recommendations for juvenile justice reform from [Renewing Juvenile Justice](#) at OJJDP's poster session. Dinky Manek Enty wrote a [blog](#) about her experience,

## **International delegation visits CJCJ on November 3, 2011 to discuss best juvenile justice practices**

CJCJ is proud to host a visit by an international delegation of 24 emerging leaders who have been selected to participate in the State Department-sponsored International Visitor Leadership Program.

The participants represent judges, attorneys, magistrates, and members of high courts from the countries of: Afghanistan, Albania, Argentina, Armenia, Cameroon, Egypt, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Hungary, India, Iraq, Kenya, Macedonia, Malawi, Malaysia, Mexico, Mozambique, Nigeria, Philippines, Poland, South Africa, Sudan, and Turkey.

The meeting will focus on how to bring together academic research, technical expertise, and a commitment to a more humane criminal justice system to promote concrete, effective reforms in the juvenile justice system.
